Since its inception in 1994, the 100 Black Men of Madison has organized African American professional and community leaders in Dane county around making a positive difference in the lives of area youth - especially African American males – through mentoring, education, health and wellness, and economic development programs.

WHAT IS PROJECT SOAR?

Project SOAR (Student Opportunities, Access and Readiness) is a comprehensive program created to lower truancy rates and raise high school graduation rates amongst African-American male students between the ages of 12 and 17 who attend a middle school or high school in the Madison Metropolitan School District. The program involves one-on-one mentoring, career exploration, and cultivating discussion on a number of social issues. By the time the students complete the program, they will gain a positive self-perception, identify SMART (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, Timely) career goals, and develop skills to influence others.
